**Dean Radin, Ph.D.**, is a Senior Scientist at the Institute of Noetic Sciences. For more than sixteen years, Dr. Radin has conducted experimental studies of psychic phenomena in academia and industry, including appointments at Princeton University and the University of Edinburgh. Dr. Radin has a Ph.D. in Educational Psychology and is one of the preeminent researchers of consciousness and psychic phenomena in the world today. He is the author of an award-winning book *The Conscious Universe*. Dr. Radin is the founder of the Consciousness Research Laboratory and a current member of The Global Consciousness Project, a study of the large-scale interactions between mind and matter.

He is the author of countless articles and sixteen books, among them, *How Dreams Help* and *Understandable Jung*.
