Steven Fromholz is the current Poet Laureate of Texas and has been called one of the last real Texas Troubadours. During his 40 year career he's been a singer, songwriter, poet, author, playwright, actor, storyteller, white water river guide and humorist extraordinaire. He was one of the charter members of the "outlaw music" genre in Texas and has been inducted into the Texas Music Hall of Fame.

Besides his own recording career, which has included a stint in Stephen Still's band, and 15 of his own albums, Fromholz is known as a "songwriter's songwriter." His tunes have been recorded by John Denver, Michael Martin Murphy, Willie Nelson, Lyle Lovett, and a host of other well-known entertainers.

His writing extends beyond music. His book, *The Texas Trilogy*, based on his song of the same name, has just been published and a book of his poems will be out in the fall as part of the Texas Poet Laureate series.

He has extensive stage and screen credits and has been recognized as one of the 10 best river guides in the U.S. He currently performs with his new band, The Texas Flatliners.
